What's Included in Microsoft 365 Business Subscriptions

Microsoft 365 Business comes in three main plans - Basic, Standard, and Premium - each offering different features depending on your needs and level of security.

Here's a quick breakdown of what's included, and how to get the most out of it.

Feature	What You Get	How to Use It Effectively	Real-Life Example
Outlook & Exchange Email	Business-class email with calendars, contacts, and 50GB mailboxes.	Use shared mailboxes (e.g. sales@company.com) instead of forwarding. Apply rules and retention policies to keep inboxes tidy.	A logistics firm uses a shared mailbox so multiple team members can reply to client requests without missing a beat.
OneDrive & SharePoint	1 TB cloud storage per user and shared team sites for files.	Replace network drives and email attachments with shared document libraries. Use version history to track edits.	An accountancy practice now co-authors spreadsheets live in SharePoint — no more "Final_V2_Really_Final.xlsx".
Teams	Chat, video meetings, and collaborative workspaces.	Create Teams for departments or projects, with channels for different topics. Integrate Planner, Forms, or shared documents.	A design agency keeps every client project in a dedicated Teams channel — with visuals, chat, and approvals in one place.
Office Apps (Word, Excel, PowerPoint)	Always-up-to-date desktop, web, and mobile versions.	Use online co-authoring, templates, and autosave to avoid version chaos.	A marketing firm collaborates on proposals in real-time, saving multiple rounds of feedback.
Security & Device Management (Premium plan)	Advanced protection via Microsoft Defender, Intune, MFA and conditional access.	Enforce MFA for all users. Use Intune to manage laptops and phones, with encryption and remote wipe.	A financial advisor protects sensitive data with device policies and MFA, meeting compliance with FCA requirements.

How Businesses Can Get More from Microsoft 365

Even without upgrading your licence, there are many ways to make your subscription work harder for you:

1. Automate Routine Tasks

Use Power Automate to reduce manual admin.

For example:

- Automatically save email attachments to SharePoint.
- Alert managers when a document is approved.
- Remind staff when licences or certifications expire.

Example: A Leicester-based construction company uses Power Automate to send reminders for expiring health and safety certificates - saving hours of manual tracking.

2. Centralise Communication and Files

Replace multiple apps (Zoom, WhatsApp, Dropbox) with a unified system:

- Use Teams for calls, chat and meetings.
- Store and share files via SharePoint accessible anywhere, securely.
- Sync documents to local devices with OneDrive for offline access.

Example: A Derby-based firm eliminated five separate tools by adopting Teams and SharePoint, reducing software costs and simplifying IT management.

3. Boost Data Security

Cyber threats are on the rise, and Microsoft 365 can help protect your business - if configured correctly.

- Enable Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) for all users.
- Use Conditional Access to block sign-ins from unapproved devices.
- Turn on Defender for Office 365 to detect phishing and malicious attachments.
- Apply Data Loss Prevention (DLP) to prevent sensitive information leaving the business.
- Example: A Nottingham accountancy practice prevented a near miss with a phishing email thanks to Microsoft Defender's automatic link scanning.

4. Empower Hybrid & Remote Working

Microsoft 365 was built for flexible work.

Encourage staff to:

- Use Teams meetings with live transcription for note-taking.
- Share project updates in Teams channels instead of lengthy emails.
- Access files securely from anywhere no VPN needed.
- Example: A Leicester engineering firm uses Teams to connect office staff with site engineers through video calls and shared drawings, all synced via OneDrive.

5. Use Insights & Reporting

Within Microsoft 365 you can access:

- Usage analytics to track adoption.
- Security & compliance dashboards to monitor risks.
- Teams analytics to see collaboration trends.
- grip: Schedule regular reviews to identify underused tools or gaps in training.

Power Apps	Build custom apps without coding.	Companies automating field reports, inspections, or form submissions.
Microsoft Purview (Compliance Add-on)	Data retention, DLP, audit, and compliance management.	Firms in regulated industries (finance, legal, healthcare).
Third-Party Backup Solutions	Independent backups of emails, Teams, and SharePoint data.	Every business - for disaster recovery and compliance peace of mind.
